UNDERGRADUATE FINANCIAL AID POLICIES

IU Jacobs School of Music financial aid is merit-based and offered to qualified applicants through the Office of Music Admissions and Financial Aid. Applicants are automatically considered for merit-based aid at the time of admission. The Director of Music Admissions and the Financial Aid Committee determine music merit-based financial aid based on audition rating and institutional need.

REQUIREMENTS

Enrollment

Recipients of music merit-based financial aid must be enrolled full-time at the Jacobs School of Music.

Change of Program

Current recipients of music merit-based financial aid who are admitted to a new degree or diploma program will be reconsidered for aid based on their new audition rating as well as institutional need.

Time Limit

Students in an undergraduate degree program are eligible to receive music merit-based financial aid for a maximum of 8 semesters. Summer sessions are not included in this limit.

Grade Point Average

To receive Jacobs School of Music financial aid, recipients must maintain a minimum cumulative Indiana University GPA of 3.0.

Satisfactory Progress

Recipients must make satisfactory degree progress, as determined by the Director of Undergraduate Studies. Probation in any semester will lead to discontinuation of music merit-based financial aid beginning in the next semester of enrollment.

Ensemble Requirement

Recipients must have a passing grade of D- or better in ensemble each semester, if ensemble enrollment is required for the degree. Failure to pass ensemble will lead to discontinuation of music merit-based financial aid until the student passes two ensembles in the next semester of enrollment.

Performance Study Requirement

Recipients must have a passing grade of D- or better in major-field lessons each semester. Failure in any semester will lead to discontinuation of Jacobs School of Music financial aid beginning in the next semester of enrollment.
